# **Farewell to Howard Cohn**

Howard Cohn was an avid hiker and skier who had an incurable zest for the outdoors. His passion for the outdoors began when he visited a friend, Amber Jones, who had moved to the Washington, DC, metro area. She introduced him to hiking in Virginia and he immediately fell in love with hiking. Coming from a state that is not known for its mountains, Michigan, he decided to move with his wife to Washington, DC, so that he could take advantage of the mountains.

I first met Howard and his wife Debbie on a Center Hiking club hike to Shenandoah Park around 1986. The group had decided to have dinner at the Chinese restaurant in Warrenton, Virginia, and I remember Howard's excitement about going on a hut-to-hut trip in the White Mountains of New Hampshire. In fact, just after two years, he had organized two trips to the White Mountains as a volunteer leader. The second trip to New Hampshire was my first trip with him, after which we traveled together on a number of hiking and ski trips. Howard led numerous hike trips as a leader in the Center hiking club and led a trip to Craftsbury, Vermont, for the STS.

Peggy Alpert, Howard, his wife Debbie and I usually got together on both club and private skiing and hiking trips nearly each year for nearly 10 years. It will be very difficult for Peggy and myself to not have another trip out west with Howard.

When I was with Howard, he loved to talk politics. He also was a prolific reader and had a great deal of knowledge and interest in rock and roll. Although on the reserved side, it did not take much to bring out his warm and engaging side. He was quite tolerant and forgiving of the faults of his friends and outdoor buddies. Howard was also a highly competent auditor who was highly regarded in his job at the Drug Enforcement Agency for designing and managing a database accounting tracking system. He worked and played hard.



This year, Howard decided to plan a trip to Glacier National Park, where he had previously hiked in 1990. Howard and his wife organized a trip for the end of July. On the fateful date of July 27, 2004, Howard Cohn did his last hike, to Grinnell Glacier. When we got to the base of the Glacier, Howard decided that he had to climb to the top and walk down the glacier to get the full experience. Not having technical equipment, he walked for about 100 feet on the glacier and fell

into a crevasse. The fall was 40 feet. A rescue committee of 10 people with two helicopters flying in tried to save him. He was reached 4.5 hours after he had fallen in, definitely too late as the temperature in a crevasse is 32 degrees.

His death may not have been as much a tragedy for him as it was to his family and friends. Howard dreaded mediocrity and boredom more than the challenges and fulfillment of participating in the outdoors. One thing we can all say about Howard is that he lived his life to the fullest in his own way.—Stephen Brickel

# Is Electronic UPSLOPE for YOU?



WHERE: The Potomac Appalachian Trail Club (PATC) headquarters at 118 Park Street, Vienna, VA 22180 [directly behind the Southern States which itself is on corner of Park & Maple Sts.(VA Rt.123) in Vienna]

Getting to the fair is easy, but depends upon your starting point! Once you find the intersection of Interstate 66 and Interstate 495 (alias the Washington Beltway), take the Nutley Street North (VA Rt. 243) exit just outside the Beltway. Go north just over 1 mile passing two traffic lights. When you get to the third light, turn right onto Route 123 (alias Maple Avenue). Continue in the right-hand lane for about ¾ mile or count traffic lights. When you reach the fourth light, turn right onto Park Street. The PATC headquarters is the second building on the left, a red brick two-story structure with parking in front. There is ample parking in the area. It is convenient to shop at the nearby SAFEWAY, then visit the Fair.
